The Cup is named after Patricia Donaghy who was involved in education in Inchicore College in Dublin; was a Treasurer of the Ladies HEC; and was also the first editor of Peil Magazine in 1999, which had its nucleus in the Higher Education section of the LGFA.14 different colleges have won this title, with four winning it twice - DIT, RCSI, Marino Institute of Education and St. Pat's College Drumcondra. The Lynch Cup is the second longest running of the Championships and it was won by Mary Immaculate College in its first year. The Cup is named after former Mary Immaculate College lecturer Noreen Lynch (RIP) who was central to the promotion of Gaelic Games in the teacher training college for many years. The competition began in 1996, with a big spread of winners over the years. Mary Immaculate College and DCU both have won the title on three occasions. UCC and Trinity College Dublin have claimed it twice. The current title holders are T.U.S. Midlands, who under their previous name of Athlone I.T. were winners in 2012. Similarly, 2019 champions TU Dublin, were successful under their previous name of Dublin Institute of Technology back in 1998.

Seven different colleges have won the Giles Cup, which is named after Geraldine Giles, who was LGFA President from 2003 to 2009; and was first played for in 2010. 2022 Giles Cup Champions Mary Immaculate College, Limerick lead the Roll of Honour with three titles. Two sides have won it twice. NUI Maynooth (now known as Maynooth University) were the first winners of the competition and also successful in 2013; while Waterford I.T. (now SETU Waterford) were victorious in 2011 and 2018. Others to taste success were Trinity College Dublin (2015); St Pat's College, Drumcondra (2016); DCU's second team (2017) and Ulster University Jordanstown (2019).



The O'Connor Cup has been played for since 1987 and is named after Michael O'Connor. The top-tier Championship has had 11 different winners, with UL leading the charge with 12 titles, having won their first title in 1993. Mary Immaculate College were the first winners, with UCC, Waterford RTC and Thomond College also successful pre a UL five-in-a-row from 1993. It wasn't until 2000 that a college from outside of Munster took the top prize, with IT Sligo victorious. UCD registered a three-in-a-row from 2001-2003 and won five titles in six years, with UL also taking honours during that spell. UUJ claimed their first (and only title to date) in 2008, while DCU's first success came the following year to kick-start a three-in-a-row. UCC added their third title after a long wait in 2012 (previous winners in 1988 and 1990) Queens University Belfast claimed their only title to date in 2013, while UL have won five of the seven Championships played for since, with UCD (2016) and DCU (2018) the other winners. The 2020 weekend wasn't run because of the pandemic and there was no Championship weekend either in 2021.
