Learn to Lead Launches

hile there are more and more women getting involved in the decision making structures of the LGFA. Last year the Strategic Roadmap 2017-2022 was launched and a key area highlighted was to 'define a model to promote Female Leadership across the Association.'

The need for a Female Leadership Programme was identified, as part of the overall Female Leadership strategy. Under the guidance of National Games Development Manager Lyn Savage, the 'Learn to Lead' programme was devised.

The aim of the programme is to develop the next generation of female leaders within Ladies Gaelic Football. Participants

were invited to apply for 1 of the 4 available strands depending on where their interests lie – coaching, officiating, administration and PR/Media. The course will be delivered over 12 months and only 5 applicants per strand were chosen for each strand.

For the coming year each participant will also be assigned a mentor who is currently working in their area of interest. This will allow the participant to not only gain knowledge from the workshops and self development sessions run by the LGFA but also from interactions with somebody who has experience on the cold face.

Day one of the programme set the bar high as the keynote address was delivered by former President of Ireland, Mary McAleese, and course content was delivered by Niamh McElwain, who designs and teaches transformational learning programmes at Google.

Over the coming year we will be following the participants here in Peil Magazine and on all the LGFA Online Channels in order to share in their development over the course of the programme.
